

During the Academic Year 2015/16 the school received £8,625 for school sport. The school spent all of its funding as follows:

Jonny Hughes sports coaching - after school clubs on 2 afternoons per week for Years 3 to 6 including Football, Kwik Cricket, Ball Skills, Tag Rugby and Athletics: £1900

Coach hire to competitions and events: £886 (cross country, kwik cricket, tennis coaching, outdoor activities at the Pioneer Centre/Old Vicarage Centre)

Archery Club: £72

Football competition entries: £40

Swimming Gala Expenses: £50

Forest School Activities for Years R, 1 and 2: £3,000

After school martial arts club for Years 2 and 3: £1330

Swimming subsidy to ensure sufficient funding for all children to have swimming lessons at different stages throughout the year: £1347

One girl won 2 gold medals and another won a silver.

During the academic year the school will have received £8,590. This is planned to be spent as follows:

Jonny Hughes sports coaching - after school clubs on 2 afternoons per week for Years 3 to 6 including Football, Kwik Cricket, Ball Skills, Tag Rugby and Athletics: £1,900

Coach hire to competitions and funding to cover teaching staff accompanying children at these events: £1,200 (e.g. cross country, kwik cricket, football)

Forest School Activities for Years R, 1 and 2: £2,000

After school martial arts club for Years 2 and 3: £1,330

New playground markings for sports and games: £2,000

The impact of the above spending has been:

- High quality PE lessons and sports clubs have been delivered by Jonny Hughes Coaching for children in Years 3 to 6 providing opportunities to develop skills in football, kwik cricket, tag rugby, athletics and general ball skills. Teaching Assistants work alongside the coaches to develop their own skills in sport leadership.

- High attendance levels at weekly after school sports clubs provided by Jonny Hughes Coaching aimed at different children at different times of the year.

- Swimming sessions maintained at previous levels despite increased costs.

Sustainability: These teaching sessions are taught by school staff.

- Participation in competitions with other schools due to hiring transport.

- Regular Forest School outdoor activities for children in Years R, 1, 2, 3 and 4 giving them opportunities to explore and interact with their outdoor environment and creating an enthusiasm for outdoor learning.

Sustainability: teachers and Teaching assistants are working closely with our specialist Forest Schools Teacher to develop their own Forest School skills.

- Martial Arts club for Years 2 and 3 has provided skills in a number of martial arts disciplines and opportunities to undertake grading. Some children have been enthused to join an additional martial arts club in a neighbouring community

- Football competitions against other Shropshire Schools at Sundorne sports facilities have encouraged many to children to become involved in competitive football in the local area.

Sustainability: Football competitions are organised and supervised by existing members of staff. Children are encouraged to become members of local junior teams.

In addition to the above, all Year 6 children have been trained to be Playground Leaders and organise lunchtime sports activities each day for the children in the other year groups. These activities have encouraged a greater participation in active play and team games as well as developing leadership skills in our Year 6.

This summer the School Council organised a Sports Activity Day and raised £65 for the Harry Johnson Trust. The children competed against each other in a range of fun sport activities.

The school was awarded the School Games Bronze award in the Autumn Term 2016 and is working towards gaining the silver award in the summer 2017.
